Survive and Save Events

This year we have seen an increase in the number of people taking part in the Survive and Save scheme. This scheme follows on from the Rookie Lifeguard programme and introduces new elements like Beach and Open Water Lifesaving. In September, some of our Survive and Save members took place in both Beach and Open Water assessments. We are super proud of how they represented our club and in their achievements on the day.

Matilda, Brett, Ben, Will, George and Dan achieved their Survive and Save Bronze Stillwater and Bronze Beach Medallions.

As a result of these events, we also have the youngest ever Survive and Save Distinction winner, Izzy Serventi. Izzy has completed 3 Survive and Save Gold awards within a 2 year period and has now been awarded the distinction. Her next goals are to continue to promote the RLSS values by teaching the next generation of lifesavers.

Our Rookie Lifeguards; Jacob, Scarlett, Alfie and Miguel also went to Boundary Water Park to take part in an interclub competition. Jacob came first, and they all worked very hard. Well done to our Rookies!

Lifesaving Academy

RLSS UK has just launched the new National Lifesaving Academy awards. These are a suite of progressive awards that teach personal survival, first aid, CPR, rescue, and fitness skills to anyone aged 12 years and over. Their aim is to teach candidates how to stay safe around water and how to safely assist others who may have gotten into difficulty in both aquatic and non-aquatic situations.

As part of the programme, they have brought back the prestigious Bronze Medallion, recognising this important part of the RLSS UK heritage.

The awards are structured to teach foundational skills and then progressively build up the candidate's skills. On achieving the Bronze Medallion level of award, the candidate receives Recognition of Prior Learning hours towards the RLSS UK vocational lifeguard qualifications.

The awards are structured into three levels (Bronze Lifesaving Certificate, Bronze Star, and Bronze Medallion), and multiple environmental strands are available at the Bronze Star and Bronze Medallion levels; Pool, Open Water and Beach.

For those of you who are currently running Survive & Save, this will continue to be offered until September 2023.

We will start to introduce the new awards next year.

financial Information

Last year, we were informed that the pool hire was going to increase from £75 to £118.75. This large increase was a huge concern for us as we were without access to our bank account and were struggling to meet the £75 a week requirement. We had a huge recruitment drive and increased our weekly cost to £4 a session and are now able to access our bank account again. Due to this, we will now meet the increase of costs on most weeks and so are not looking at increasing weekly fees next year.

In the past, our membership has been a yearly fee of £15 (plus £10 for every additional child). Due to an increase in costs from the RLSS, we have had a complete review of our membership. From January, membership will be £7.50 per term (January, April and September), with £6.50 for each additional child. There is an option to pay this in a yearly sum of £22.50 per year and £19.50 for each additional child.

But what changes? From January 1st, all badges and certificates from the Rookie Lifeguard and Survive and Save schemes will be fully subsidised by the club.
