Prowning Prevention Week

Drowning Prevention Week (DPW) is one of the largest summer water safety campaigns across the UK and Ireland.

It is the RLSS UK's biggest campaign of the year, targeting families, carers, teachers and instructors of children aged five to fifteen years old with the aim of educating them about water safety.

The campaign took place from 15th to 22nd June and our social media feed was full of useful information. The children of Wybunbury Delves C of E Aided Primary School got involved by colouring in the RLSS UK DPW flags and putting them up around school.

No child should drown, and with the right water safety education – such as knowledge of the Water Safety Code – accidental drownings are preventable. Drowning Prevention Week is deliberately timed ahead of the school summer holidays when children spend more time outdoors and when vital water safety skills can help keep children safe.

Thank you for helping us to spread the word this year, and encouraging everyone to have the water safety conversation with children. DPW is critical in raising awareness and encouraging the public to enjoy water safely. Rookie Lifeguard - Master Award

The Rookie Master Lifeguard Award recognises Rookie Lifeguards who have achieved an outstanding standard through the Rookie Lifeguard programme.

To achieve this special award, lifesavers must have passed the following awards:

- Rookie Lifeguard Gold Level 3
- Rookie Lifeguard Water Safety Award
- Rookie Lifeguard Life Support
- Any 3 additional bolt-on awards

To ensure that as many of our Rookie Lifeguards meet the criteria by the time they pass Rookie Lifeguard Gold 3, we are going to provide all Rookie Lifeguards with the resources they need to pass the Rookie Lifeguard Water Safety Award, in the next couple of months.

To pass this award, they must complete a workbook from the RLSS UK. It will teach provide them with all the knowledge they need to pass the quizzes set within the workbook.

This award is a fun way to learn how to enjoy the water and keep yourself, friends and family, safe around water. They'll learn all about the WATER SAFETY Code and explore different water dangers you could find at the pool, beach and even in your own home.

Once they have completed the workbook, it just needs to be passed back to Em and Liam so they can check everything has been completed, and then hand out the awards.

The cost of this award is covered by your subs, so there is no additional cost involved.
